Riding Fees & Permits

Fees and permits are required for use of Turkey Bay Off-Highway Vehicle Area and Wranglers Horse Trails. Fees are not required for hiking, biking, or backpacking.

Turkey Bay Off-Highway Vehicle Area

Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) riding is only permitted at Turkey Bay OHV Area.

Riding Permits:

- 2024 Annual Riding Permit: \$100 Valid December 1, 2023 to December 31, 2024
- 1 to 3-day Permit: \$20 Valid 1-3 consecutive days from date of purchase

Where to purchase permits:

OHV riding permits cannot be purchased online. Riding permits can be purchased at the Turkey Bay OHV Area Gatehouse (Fri-Sun) OR 7 days a week at the Golden Pond Visitor Center. If the gatehouse is not staffed, you must get your riding permit at the Golden Pond Visitor Center (Visitor Center open daily year-round, 9am-5pm).

Turkey Bay OHV Area Hours of Operation:

Riding times are sunrise to sunset, with permit. Turkey Bay OHV Area is open 7 days a week. Any weather-related closures (heavy rains or saturated soil conditions) will be posted on the Alerts page of our website and on the trail closures hotline: 270.924.2000 and press "1".

Camping at Turkey Bay OHV Area Campground:

\$12 per camping unit per night. Two 24-hour generator areas, chemical toilets, and drinking water are available. Camping registration is self-service at the information kiosk in front of the gatehouse. Camping is not permitted outside of the designated camping area.

Wranglers Horse Trails Day Use Fees

A Day Use Riding permit is required for each horse trailer entering Land Between the Lakes:

- One Day Permit: \$10—Can be purchased online or at Wranglers Campground
- Annual Permit: \$100 Valid Jan. 1 Dec. 31, 2024 Can only be purchased at Wranglers Campground

· Inside the cabins:

These rustic, one-room cabins have a heater/air conditioner, ceiling fan with light, small table, folding chairs or benches, and electrical outlets. Bring your own linens, pillows, and/or sleeping bags. The fourperson cabins have one double bed and one bunk bed. Eight-person cabins have one full bed and two bunk beds.

Outside the cabins:

Each individual cabin features its own porch, fire ring, and picnic table. Restroom/shower buildings are located in the campground near the cabins. Piney, Hillman Ferry, and Wranglers Campgrounds also have an Outpost for camping supplies and rentals.

No cooking, smoking, or pets inside the cabins. Additional camping units at the cabin sites are prohibited.

About Basic Campgrounds and Camping Areas:

- · Basic Campground amenities include defined campsites, fire rings and/or grills, picnic tables, vault toilet, trash removal, mowed areas, and a boat ramp. Basic Campgrounds include: Twin Lakes
- A Basic Camping Area is an open field area without defined campsites. Amenities might include a vault toilet, trash removal, mowed areas, and a boat ramp. However, they may or may not have picnic tables and fire rings and/or grills. You may camp anywhere within the camping area with a Basic Camping Permit. Basic Camping Areas include: Demumbers Bay, Pisgah Point, Ginger Bay, and Neville Bay
- If you plan to camp in a designated Basic Camping Facility while backpacking, you must purchase a Basic Camping Permit for each person ages 18 and over.

About Backcountry Camping:

 Backcountry Camping includes remote campsites throughout the recreation area. Areas at the ends of forest roads or along the lakeshore often make wonderful campsites. If you camp in a location not designated on our map, it is considered back country camping. Read the full Camping Rules page of our website or the General Camping Rules brochure to learn where you can and cannot camp.

Group Camping

Located on Kentucky Lake in the southern portion of Land Between the Lakes, Colson Hollow Camping Area provides 25 acres of maintained fields for camping groups of up to 200 people.

- Fees: \$40 a night, minimum of 10 people

Compatible groups may be scheduled for the same dates. Refuse container and one accessible vault toilet building are provided. Additional sanitary facilities can be provided upon request at an additional charge. In the event of heavy rain, the creek crossing may become impassable- evacuate as needed.
