ORDER NO. 60-01-15

**PUBLIC ENTRY PROHIBITED**  
**Timber Sale Area Boundaries**

Pursuant to the provisions of 16 U.S.C. Section 551, and Title 36 C.F.R. Section 261.50(a), the following acts are prohibited on the lands and waters within the legislative jurisdiction of the USDA Forest Service, Land Between The Lakes National Recreation Area. The area includes National Forest lands within Lyon County in Kentucky and is identified as the Old Ferry Road ReOffer and Paradise Timber Sales on the attached maps.

For the protection of public health, safety and property the following acts are prohibited:

1. Persons entering or being upon an area which is described below and identified on the attached map.  
**Title 36 CFR 261.53(E), Title 36 CFR 261.53(F).**

A. Old Ferry Road and Paradise Timber Sale Boundary. The sale is bounded by, but is not limited to, the Woodlands Trace on the South Southwest, Forest Service Road (FSR) 112 on the West, FSR 117 on the East and Orange painted boundary on the North.

**The above prohibitive acts are set forth in Title 36 C.F.R., Section 261. Pursuant to 36 C.F.R., 261.50(e) the following persons are exempt from the above Prohibitions:**

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting forces engaged in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons actively engaged in the removal of forest products under contract.
3. Any person that is a family member of the Paradise cemetery located next to the FSR 112 (visitors shall not deviate other than directly to or from their associated cemeteries).

Violations of the above prohibition are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than (6) six months or both. Title 16 U.S.C. 551, and Title 18 U.S.C. 3559 & 3571
