General Hunting/Trapping Regulations

- Licensed motorized vehicles permitted on numbered roads only as shown on the Land Between the Lakes Motorized Vehicle Use Map available online at <u>landbetweenthelakes.us/maps</u>. Other roads are for administrative or emergency access only.
- Parking is permitted no further than one vehicle length from a legal road.
- Do not damage or rut roads, trails, or fields.
- Do not leave campfire rings/rocks in fields, roads, or trails.
- Do not block or restrict access to any road, trail, or gate when parking.
- Unlicensed motorized vehicles are allowed only in the Turkey Bay Off-Highway Vehicle Area and require a permit.
- When transporting firearms, keep them cased and unloaded in both chamber and magazine.
- No Hunting Areas: Nature Watch Areas, wildlife refuges, safety zones around facilities, and other posted areas are closed to hunting.
- It is unlawful to discharge a weapon capable of taking human life within 150 yards of a campsite, recreation site, or occupied area, or across or on a National Forest System road.
- Waterfowl hunters may not hunt within 200 yards of waterfowl refuges or other blinds.
- Permanent blinds and pits are not allowed for waterfowl hunting. Hunting above the shoreline at any lake elevation, wading into the water, or launching a boat from Land Between the Lakes with a weapon, requires a Hunter Use Permit.
- Placement of bait or hunting over bait, including food or mineral substances, is prohibited.
- Use of any artificial light or other means designed to make wildlife visible at night are prohibited at all times except while hunting raccoons or opossums.
- Do not use paint, tape, flagging, or other artificial materials to mark trees, trails, or routes
- Hunters must not be under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances.
- Hand, mouth, or electronic calling devices permitted according to state regulations.
- · Hunt during daylight hours only unless otherwise noted.
- Hunt Hours: one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.
- No nighttime coyote or bobcat hunting on Land Between the Lakes.
- Hunting small game with dogs is permitted.
- Hunting small game on horseback is permitted.
- No species of wildlife may be harassed or taken except those authorized.
- A Land Between the Lakes Trapping Permit is no longer required for trapping.

General Guidelines

- 1. Pack it in, pack it out- leave no trace behind
- 2. You are responsible for your own safety
- See something, say something call 270.924.2000 or Law Enforcement at 877.861.2457.
- 4. For campfires, do not bring firewood from home which may harbor unwanted pests. Use only dead and downed wood or purchase firewood at our campgrounds for fuel. Attend fire at all times and put the fire out completely. Remove rock fire rings from fields and roads.
- Wildlife refuges are closed to all human entry from November 1 - March 15.
- Protect yourself from insect and tick bites.
- Respect the Resource Leave historical items, plants and flowers for others to enjoy. Respect roads and trails during wet conditions.

Land Between the Lakes offers a variety of hunting opportunities on approximately 90% of its 170,000 acres in Kentucky and Tennessee. Our seasons and regulations may be different than statewide regulations, so be sure to carefully read all information. To protect the future of hunting at Land Between the Lakes, please remain courteous and helpful to other visitors. We hope you have a safe and enjoyable hunt!

Hunter Use Permits

We require a Land Between the Lakes Hunter Use Permit for all hunters ages 16 and older. This is in addition to state licenses and tags.

- Hunter Use Permits \$25
- Combo Hunter Use + Backcountry Camping Permit \$50 Both are valid one year from date of purchase.

Purchase permits online at landbetweenthelakes.us under *Reservations and Permits*, at our Welcome Stations, and facilities. These permits are also available anywhere TN and KY hunting licenses are sold.

Hunter Safety Requirements

All hunters must possess a hunter safety card as required by state regulations.

The Land Between the Lakes Small Game, Waterfowl, and Trapping Fact Sheet is the official document that includes hunt dates. If other sources indicate something different, this document has precedence.

Coyote, Armadillo, and Groundhog

Hunt during daylight hours only during any open hunting season with weapons legal for that season.

Nighttime hunting for these species is prohibited on Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area

During February, centerfire rifles, handguns, and shotguns with shot size T or smaller may be used to harvest these 3 species.

No harvest limit.

Bird Dog, Rabbit Dog, and Raccoon Hound Training

- Dog training permitted only in Hunt Areas 2, 7, 9, 11, & 13
- Dogs must have a current rabies vaccination and wear a collar with owner's name, address, and phone number
- Horses may be used
- Land Between the Lakes Hunter Use Permit required
- · Possession of firearms prohibited

KENTUCKY SEASON: Oct 1 - 24 None may be taken or shaken out TENNESSEE SEASON: Oct 1 - 17 and Oct 21 - 24 None may be taken or shaken out

Dog Field Trials

- Special Use Permit from the USDA Forest Service and approval by the appropriate State wildlife agency required.
- Trials must be scheduled at least 2-months in advance to prevent conflicts with hunting season or recreational events

Trapping furbearers permitted by state law, including beavers

- Trapping is only permitted in Hunt Areas 3, 4, 5, 12, and 14
- All trappers must possess a Hunter Use Permit & state trapping license
- All state and federal regulations apply for trapping including legal traps, sets, species, limits, reporting, and tagging requirements
- All traps must display owner's name and address
- Areas closed to hunting are also closed to trapping

Legal Weapons for Small Game Hunting

Legal weapons follow state and federal regulations. <u>Legal weapons include</u> shotguns, rimfire rifles and handguns, air guns, muzzleloaders, and archery equipment. Falconry is also legal but must adhere to seasons listed in this document.

Prohibited weapons include shotguns loaded with slugs or buck shot, centerfire rifles, and centerfire handguns. During February, centerfire rifles and handguns, and shotguns with shot size T or smaller, may only be used for hunting coyotes, armadillos, bobcat, otter, and groundhogs.
